BLEED:

In printing, a bleed area is the extension of a design's background or images beyond the final trim size of the printed piece. This extra area, typically 0.125" (1/8 inch) on all sides, ensures that when the printed sheet is cut to its final size, there are no unprinted white edges due to slight shifts in the paper during the cutting process.

SAFE ZONE:

In printing, the safe zone is the area within the final trimmed size of a printed piece where all important content, like text and important images, should be placed. This is to ensure that nothing critical gets accidentally cut off during the trimming process, as there can be slight variations in where the cut is made. Essentially, it's a buffer zone inside the trim line to protect your design's essential elements.
